### **HALL OF FAME – 2003**

**MARTHA HOFFMAN**, is inducted posthumously into the Madison WBA Hall of Fame in the Superior Performance category in August 2003.

Martha was a member of MWBA for over 50 years and at one point in her bowling career carried a 181 average.

Our early records show that Martha won a singles event at the University of Wisconsin in 1932 at the age of 21 and later won several first place championships in MWBA Tournaments beginning in 1935 and continuing on during various years in the 1950's.

Competing on the state level Martha won the singles title in 1952 and team in 1953. She competed in 36 WIBC Championship Tournaments and the highlight came when she rolled a 296 game during one of these tournaments; the highest score ever rolled at the time in a National Tournament and this led to a 693 series in Singles.

Martha served her association as a member of the Board of Directors – the earliest date being 1942 through 1953. She was once again elected for a period from 1967 through 1978.

For her distinguished bowling career, Martha was honored by being inducted into the WIBC Hall of Fame and Museum. A dedicated bowler, Martha also enjoyed the game and the friends she made.
