HALL OF FAME – 2002

SALLY DAUBERT, member of Madison WBA, is inducted into the MWBA Hall of Fame in the Superior Performance category in August 2002.

Sally has been a member of MWBA for 35 years and has a career high 3-game series of 731. She has a career high game of 280, carried a 193 high average and is still maintaining an average in the 180's.

During her 35 years as a MWBA member, Sally has competed in 35 MWBA Championship Tournaments; winning 5 Class A Team Championships, the first of which came in 1977 when as a member of the Cathay House Team rolled a 3000 series which still stands as an all-time record. In the years 1985 and 1986 her JP Forms Team garnered the high scratch totals and in 1987 as a member of the Schwoegler's Park Towne Team won another championship and again in 1989 the same team took both scratch and handicap honors. On an individual level, in 1990, Sally captured another MWBA Tournament championship by winning Class A Scratch All-Events with a 1685.

On the state level, in 1994, Sally and her teammates on the Kail Decorating Team placed First in Division 1 Team Event with a total of 3071.

Over the years, Sally has consistently bowled as a champion. In the years from 1969 through 2000, she has received 12 Madison WBA Season High Team Game Awards with the 1992 Kail Decorating Team holding the all-time record of 1126. Adding to this, her teams have rolled 9 Madison WBA Season High Team Series with once again the Kail Decorating Team holding the 1993 all-time record of 3015.

Sally has been the recipient of the Helen Iverson Award as well as being a member of the National, State, and Local 600 Clubs and a member of the Les Dames 700 Club.

She has more than 25 league championships and over 20 league high series and game awards and has contributed value service as a league office and committee member.

Sally brings the true meaning of sportsmanship to the sport of bowling through her love of the game, performance and competitive spirit.
