Pat Lashore is inducted into the MWBA Hall of Fame in the Superior Performance category in August 2015.

Pat has been a Madison WBA member since 1974, bowling in various leagues including the Big Eight league at both Bowl-a-Vard Lanes and All Star Lanes, the Eastside Couples league at Dream Lanes, and All Star Co-Ed Classic league at Village Lanes.

In 1999, Pat, as part of the Lighthouse team, posted her first local MWBA championship tournament win with a scratch team title. The Lighthouse team successfully defended this title in both 2000 and 2001.

Pat, an active tournament bowler, has participated in many tournaments and in 1994 won a WWBA State Championship title as part of the Kail Decorating team. In addition, in 1997, Pat posted the High Tournament Game of 288 in the WWBA State Championship Tournament. In addition, Pat won 2014 Madison 600 Club tournament with a scratch score of 726 scratch / 828 handicap.

Pat and her teammates from Kail Decorating, Lighthouse, and Ritters Critters won 8 MWBA High Team Scratch Series awards and 6 MWBA High Team Scratch Game awards from 1992 – 2004. With her Ritters Critters team from 2003-2004 still holding the MWBA city record with a 3,143 Team Scratch Series.

Pat bowled her career high series in 1998-1999 with a 741. She claims a high game of 288 bowled in 1997 and a career high average of 198 in 2002.

Pat has been an active league member, having served as secretary-treasurer for her couples league for 10 years.

Pat truly loves the sport of bowling and is always willing to cheer on both her teammates and her competitors.
